I'm now hard at work illustrating my next two books, as well as trying to finish writing a children's novel. (I can't ever say that I'm bored!)

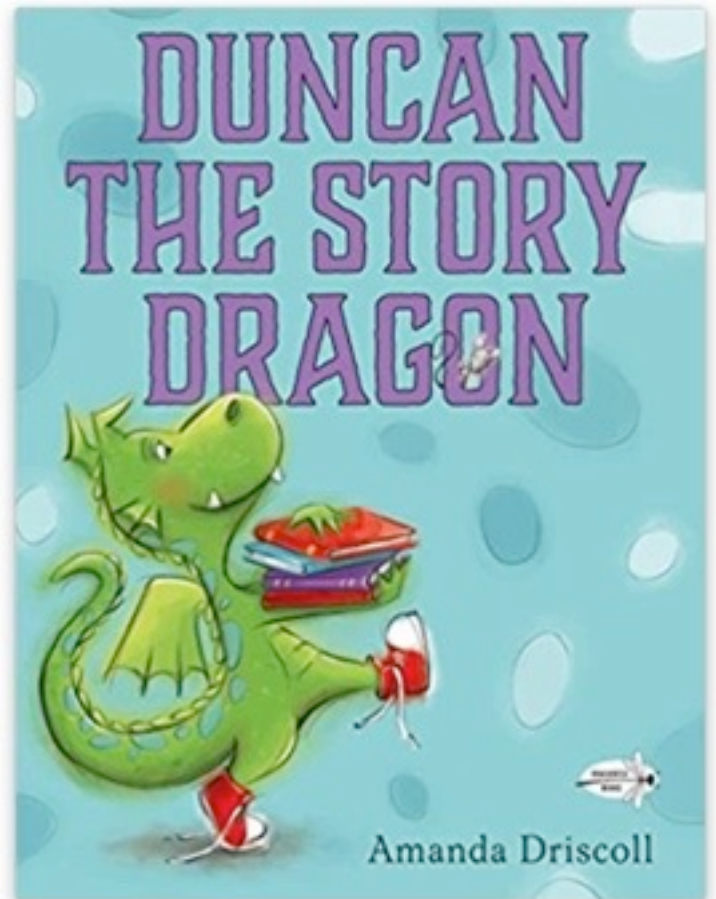
- This month I'd like to recommend "**Duncan the Story Dragon**" by Amanda Driscoll.
